


I am concerned about the number of teardowns in Wellesley.

Wellesley has kept mansionization in check over the past decade




16.5% agree that Wellesley has kept mansionization in check over the past decade

15.9% neither agree nor disagree (or N/A)


The bulk and massing of new houses are, in general, a concern.

17.7% disagree that the bulk and massing of new houses are, in general, a concern 9.8% neither agree nor disagree (or N/A)


New houses in Wellesley are, in general, too tall.



55.6% agree that new houses in Wellesley are, in general, too tall


22.6% disagree that new houses in Wellesley are, in general, too tall 21.9% neither agree nor disagree (or N/A)

Trees that are cut down during construction are replaced with an adequate amount of new vegetation and plantings.




25.5% agree that trees cut down are replaced with an adequate amount of new vegetation

53.8% disagree that trees cut down are replaced with an adequate amount of new vegetation


