

## Additional Information:

• "The ground for St. Andrew's Chapel was broken on June 18, 1894, with appropriate ceremony. The Rev. G.W. Shinn, D.D., Rector of Grace Church, Newton, delivered the Address. The Chapel was completed in the middle of November, and the first Services were held in it on St. Andrew's Day, November 30. At the Evening Service the Rt. Rev. Bishop of the Diocese delivered an Address on the Life of St. Andrew. A child born on St. Andrew's Day, five years ago, was baptized. The materials used in the building of the Chapel are field-stone and wood, and the seating is 225. The architect is Mr. S.D. Hayden of Newtonville. The following gifts have been received and are gratefully acknowledged: Oak Pulpit from Mr. E.W. Flagg of New York; Altar Linen from Mrs. E.W. Flagg; Chancel Window from Grace Church, Newton; interior decorations and lamps from the proceeds of a concert given by the Choir of Grace Church, Newton; stone steps from Mrs. J.A. Porter; corner-stone from Mr. Thomas Evans; Directory Tablet, Mr. E.T. Wilson; oak Hymn Tablets, Mr. W.W. Tailby; wroughtiron Lantern for Vestibule, Mr. H.W.F. Young and Mr. Wm. Knight; Chancel Furniture, Altar Rail, Vases and Prayer Books, from friends of the Parish. The field-stone used in the building was nearly all contributed by Mr. C.B. Dana and Mr. Thomas Whipple." – Journal of the 110<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting of the Convention (1895)
